Program Features	<i>Accelerated:</i> fall and spring classes meet in 8-week sessions; summer meets in 6-week sessions <i>Asynchronous:</i> self-learning, self-paced, self-directed; no real-time instruction <i>Cohort:</i> Select number of students admitted each fall and spring all following a fixed schedule
Tuition	\$550 per unit; financial aid (including grants, loans, and scholarships) is available Flexible payment plans

LOWER-DIVISION REQUIREMENTS

<i>Lower-division requirements:</i>	Include courses needed to meet graduation requirements at Channel Islands but may not have been needed at your community college. Examples of missing courses include: • Language requirement • American Institutions • Ethnic Studies Missing lower-division courses may be completed at a CC; however, if you already transferred the maximum allowable 70 CC units, the units earned from these courses WILL NOT count toward the 120 units needed to earn the degree at CI. This means you <u>will satisfy</u> the requirement but you will <u>not earn</u> units for the course/s.
How to satisfy the language requirement?	Take a course (C- or better grade required) or take a test to prove proficiency in a particular language.
How to satisfy the multicultural requirement?	Our UDGE C course (see roadmap) also satisfies the multicultural requirement.

UPPER-DIVISION REQUIREMENTS

<i>Upper-division requirements:</i>	Include <i>11 upper-division business major/core courses</i> • Curriculum: https://ext.csuci.edu/programs/undergraduate/bs-business-online/curriculum.htm • Students must obtain a grade of "C-" or better in each course.
	Include <i>3 upper-division general education (UDGE) courses</i> • Courses are identified and selected by the online program not the student • Grades of "C-" or better are required
	Include up to <i>5 upper-division business elective courses</i> • Numbers of courses needed depends on total number of units transferred in • Grades of "D-" or better better required • Course are identified and selected by the online program not the student

HELPFUL TIPS

- Advance placement (AP) and/or College-Level Examination Program® (CLEP) exams can count for college credit. Be sure to submit your official score reports!
- A grade point average of at least 2.0 overall is required to earn the degree.
- A minimum of 120 units is required to earn the degree.
 - 70 units maximum can be transferred in from a community college or another two-year college
 - 50 units remaining to complete at CSUCI:
 - 31 units of business core courses
 - 9 units of upper-division general education (UDGE) courses
 - ~15 units of business elective courses
- CSUCI residency requirements; this is important if planning to transfer from another 4-year institution
 - 30 units must be taken in residence at CSUCI
 - 24 units of these must be upper-division coursework
 - 12 units of these must be in the major
