Spring 2026 Start, Full Time

To build your **individualized plan**, consider the following based on the example roadmap: MHA program completion requires 11 core courses (35 units), and 2 elective courses (6 units) to total 41 units. MHA program with the Graduate Certificate in Gerontology requires 11 core courses (35 units) and 3 designated electives (9 units) for a total of 44 units of completion.
