- Minimum of one-year relevant full-time clinical experience within the last 3 years.

- ☐ A minimum of two letters of recommendation dated within oneyear of application (one academic and one professional),
- ☐ A professional resume/curriculum vitae (CV),
- ☐ A 500-word statement explain academic and professional goals.
