Meet David Rensin

Perhaps you've noticed a student at OLLI classes in Ventura or Camarillo who resembles Albert Einstein?

"Yeah, I get that a lot," says David Rensin, a widely published author, coauthor, and interviewer who has been with OLLI for over eight years. "The closest I come is my middle name: Albert. Still, I've heard it from flight attendants, shoppers at Trader Joe's, and strangers who think I might not have heard it before. It's fun."

David was born in New York City and raised in Teaneck, New Jersey, until his family moved to Northridge, California, when he was 14. "We left the East Coast on February 7, 1964, the same day the Beatles arrived for their first American tour." After high school he went to



Cal State Northridge, hoping to become a surgeon, until the idea of scalpels, blood, and 8am biology class proved unappealing. Instead, he graduated in 1972 with a degree in Political Science.

David also took Journalism classes, and hung out at the school newspaper, doing music reviews and features, and his own music column. By the time he left, David was freelancing for Rolling Stone and many other music magazines. The reward: free concert tickets, records, and dating opportunities. Throughout the 1970s he profiled major rock bands, interviewed singers and songwriters both famous or just starting out, industry types, and loved going on the road. By then he was usually told he bore a passing resemblance to John Lennon, which, he says, "came in handy."



Eschewing a traditional office job, David committed to the writer's life. In the early 1980s he became a Contributing Editor of Playboy, specializing in the widely regarded Playboy Interview. He also contributed to Esquire, TV Guide, California Magazine, Coast Magazine, Crawdaddy, the Los Angeles Times, Vanity Fair, Premiere, and other outlets he's long forgotten.

In 1991, he and his friend, the late and esteemed Bill Zehme, co-wrote "The Bob Book," a best-selling, humorous

celebration of the ultimate okay guy. He has since authored or co-authored 16 books, with seven appearing on the New York Times bestseller list. They include books with comedians such as Tim Allen, Chris Rock, Garry Shandling, as well as show business super-manager, Bernie Brillstein. Other notable works include coauthoring WWII hero Louis Zamperini's extraordinary autobiography "Devil at My Heels," -- years before "Unbroken" -- and Zamperini's life-lessons book, "Don't Give Up, Don't Give In." He also collaborated on "The Men on My Couch," Dr. Brandy Engler's fly-on-wall memoir of her first year as a psychotherapist counselling only men

about sex and love. On his own, David wrote "All for a Few Perfect Waves," a widely lauded oral biography of legendary surfer Miki Dora, and "The Mailroom," an oral history about generations of entertainment industry players who started at the bottom in Hollywood, dreaming of the top—and often succeeding.

Although he surfed at "C Street" and "Surfers Point" ages ago, David and his wife, Suzie, forsook the Valley traffic 12 years ago and moved to "paradise, meaning Ventura." Their son, Emmett, is also a writer and author, now completing a doctorate in English literature at CUNY. In his spare time, David enjoys sentimental memories of surfing, dreaming about an uncluttered home, and fantasizing about who he might resemble next. Meanwhile, David looks forward to continuing with OLLI, where, he says, "the great classes, multi-talented instructors, and fellow students with their own fascinating stories, are a perfect fit."
