Meet Patricia Distad - An Enthusiastic OLLI Volunteer

Have you been on the OLLI Garden tour last Spring and wondered who organized these tours? It is the events committee including Patricia Distad, a long-time OLLI student and a volunteer from Camarillo.



Pat is a native Californian. She graduated from UC Santa Barbara with a degree in Cultural Anthropology and went on to receive elementary and secondary teaching credentials. She taught Special Education at Somis School for 6 years.

After her marriage to John, a Navy Pilot at the time at Point Mugu, they settled in Somis, where Pat developed a small Arabian horse breeding program and was elected President of the Conejo Valley Arabian Horse Association. She then had an opportunity to work for David Murdock's Ventura Farms for 17 years in their Arabian Horse Division managing various programs.

It was the tragic death of a horse trainer friend, which got Pat involved in the activities of Camarillo Hospice where she became a board member in

1996. It was here, Pat and her associate, Anita McDermott, co-chaired the first garden tour and this year marks the tour's 25 Year celebration! Pat continues to assist in finding gardens for the tour and writes the brochure descriptions.

Pat has always been interested in historic buildings. In 1998, when the City of Camarillo acquired Adolfo Camarillo's Victorian ranch home and formed the Camarillo Ranch Foundation, Pat served for 7 years as a Board member. During this period, she was involved in the renovation project to recapture the heyday of the ranch at the turn of the 20th century. For her vision and leadership during this project, Pat was honored as the Camarillo Chamber of Commerce Woman of the Year in 2002. The ranch is currently used as a museum, for youth education, and for rented events.



An ardent art lover, Pat is also a proud author of a teen novel called Island Girl, which was inspired by her granddaughters, and illustrated by her son Dodge. As a result of this novel, Pat developed an art program for students at Somis School called "Art Tuesdays", which she taught for 5 years along with a group of volunteers, until the beginning of the pandemic.

Pat has been an OLLI student for 17 years. Along the way she has formed a circle of close friends about whom she says, "We are like so many OLLI students. We share our journeys, lend our support when needed, meet for events, travel to far off places, and take classes in our specialties as well as in things we know nothing about, yet".

OLLI Members visit the Huntington Gardens and the Getty Villa

On January 9th, OLLI members visited Huntington Library, Art Museum and Botanical Gardens



in San Marino. The visitors enjoyed an extensive docent guided tour of the beautiful gardens with their large collection of flora from around the globe. They also enjoyed early 20th century architecture, especially the residential, library and museum buildings designed by Myron Hunt. In the library the collections of ancient handwritten manuscripts and early books printed around the time of the invention of the printing press were awe-inspiring.

On January 18th, a small group of OLLI members were given a docent guided tour of the exhibit

"Jewels of Ancient Sudan" at the Getty Villa. These jewels were excavated in early 20th century and belonged to three different kingdoms along the Nile river in ancient Sudan namely, Kerma, Napata and Meroe, dating back to 2400 BCE. Most of the pieces came from royal and aristocratic burials and all vividly displayed the splendor of ancient Nubian society. The design and intricacy of the jewelry were astonishing.
