
- Asya Pereltsvaig will take us through the Baltic Countries Lithuania, Latvia, & Estonia.

Meet Gerry and Colleen Robertson

Have you been to Colleen and Gerry Robertson's fabulous house in Somis? Many OLLI members visited their wonderful gardens earlier this year when OLLI had its Garden Tour. OLLI also has had two socials on their patios -- with spectacular views across the valley towards Moorpark.

Gerry's family has a long history in Ventura County. His Danish family (great-grandfather, grandfather, and father) came up from Sinaloa, Mexico in 1925 and developed the Sinaloa Ranch in Simi Valley. 
Teaching Casualty Care in Ukraine and Why Defending Their Democracy Matters: Free Seminar with Dr. Michael Baker on Zoom
