Meet Cliff Wilcox

Cliff Wilcox is the consummate educator! His passion is examining how culture has changed over time – looking at art, literature, music, and films. He compares his love of studying culture with his love of the outdoors – calling it "intellectual hiking." OLLI has been lucky to have a person of Cliff's intellect and passion as an instructor for over a dozen years.

Recently, Cliff has found his vocation meshing with his avocation. While studying chemistry at the University of Arizona, Cliff got a job with IBM in Tucson. Fortunately, IBM provided excellent training for new staff, not only in information technology, but also in customer service, budget and operations management, business planning and people. These skills were important for any vocation and set Cliff up for a successful, varied career.



In 1991, Cliff and his wife, Michelle moved to Ann Arbor to attend graduate school together at the University of Michigan – he for a Ph.D. in intellectual history, she for an MD. Following graduation from Michigan, they moved to Jacksonville, FL, where Cliff taught US and world history at the Bolles Prep School, and Michelle joined a private internal medicine practice. After a little over a year in Florida, they decided that they would be better off settling near family in the west. With friends in Ventura, they found compelling opportunities in both technology for Cliff and medicine for Michelle. Cliff took a job with a consulting firm that worked exclusively at Kinko's national headquarters in Ventura in their large technology division. His wife worked at Ventura County Medical Center and later also joined the teaching faculty at Community Memorial Hospital.

Cliff was still interested in teaching positions in 2011, when he met Marty Kaplan, the Director of OLLI at CSUCI, who suggested that he apply. Lucky for us, Cliff has been teaching regularly at OLLI for over ten years. Meanwhile, he has left the tech world to work full time as the Director of Education and Operations at Temple Beth Torah (TBT) in Ventura. With six teachers and two program staff, Cliff is the consummate educator who helps guide teachers to improve their craft and change children's lives. Wearing his old hat, he is also installing a new IT system with cloud-based data services at TBT.
